<p><i>The purpose of this story is to highlight the work across the Trust to raise carer awareness and to support, value and involve carers in decision-making and caring.</i></p>			
Summary of key issues			
<p>Sue Bass cares for her husband Andrew who has dementia. She has worked closely with SASH staff to raise the profile of carers and improve how we value, involve and support them when the person they care for is a patient with us and when plans are being made for their discharge.</p> <p>Eighteen months ago the Trust set up a Carers Steering group that has overseen the approval of our carers strategy and carers charter (also adopted by other acute trusts in Surrey), signing up to John's campaign, introducing a carers passport and developing close collaborative partnerships with Carers Support (in West Sussex and Surrey).</p> <p>Sue shares her story as part of the dementia leads three day programme and will explain to the Board the impact and benefits of recognising and respecting the role carers can play during a hospital stay.</p>
