In order to support you as you work in different areas of the hospital all wards where the scheme is operational will have detailed information leaflets that should be made available to you at the start of your shift. If you see the butterfly logo and no-one has explained about it to you at the start of your shift, PLEASE be certain to ask the nurse in charge of the ward to explain it to you.

This is essentially a scheme that will help all staff within East Surrey Hospital to better support people with dementia or memory difficulties and in doing so help us to improve the care we deliver. So I would urge you to take the time at the start of your shift to find out more.

Where patients have a Butterfly in their notes or on the handover sheets, please check if the family have completed a Reach out To Me document. This the staff insights to the person and may be useful when providing individualised care.
